

The Intellectual Property (IP) Awareness Assessment has ten categories covering various aspects of IP and the questions in each category have been formulated to discover the participant's overall IP awareness. The first question in each category is broadly designed to determine if the category is relevant and if the individual taking the assessment needs additional information and training in the category. If the response to the opening question of a category indicates that the individual is aware of the information covered in the category or if the category is not relevant or applicable, the assessment will skip to the next category. If you are not sure of the appropriate answer to any of the questions within the category or if you would like additional information you can choose "not sure" or the option that may indicate that you are not fully aware of the specific area in a category.
